## PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Respected Prof. Rajesh Tandon, Dean Students Welfare, University of Delhi and Chief Guest of our Annual Day Function, Prof. Prakash Narayan, Honourable Chairperson of our Governing body, Prof. Rita Singh, Honourable Treasurer of our Governing body, other members of Governing body, Dr. K. P. Chinda, our founder Principal, and esteemed guests, my colleagues from teaching and non-teaching fraternity, dear students and their parents, a very good morning to all of you. I, on behalf of Keshav Mahavidyalaya, welcome you all on the occasion of the College Annual Day and Prize Distribution Function.

I am happy to announce that Keshav Mahavidyalaya has successfully completed 24 years and has earned a great reputation. Next year with God's grace we shall be celebrating our Silver Jubilee. Our college at present offers nine courses in the disciplines of Science, Commerce, Management Studies, Psychology, and Computer Science and hopes to add a few more courses soon. The college also offers short-term certificate course in French and German Languages. On popular demand from students, the college has sent its request to University of Delhi for offering one year diploma course in both these languages. This year the college also offered add on course in 'Radio Broadcasting' of 40 hours duration. Mr. R. K. Singh, former Engineer-in-chief, Doordarshan, and former Consultant, DUCR and Dr. Anjali Thukral from the college were the co-ordinators for the course. 18 students successfully completed the course. In the current academic session, the student strength is around 1600. The college also has a Girls Hostel running for the past four years where the residents are provided with an atmosphere of warmth, peace, and security.

Further, I present several other laurels achieved by our students. From sports field, Sarthak Kataria & Aditya Alok from College Taekwondo (Men) team secured I position in Delhi University Inter College Tournament 2017-18. Five of our students - Prashant Kadiyan, Mohit Dagar, Sarthak Kataria, Aditya Alok & Deepanshi, participated in the All India Inter University Tournaments 2017-18. At the technology front, a young aspirant of our college, Anshuman Bhardwaj of B.Sc. (H) Computer Science I year, has created a YouTube playlist for the tutorials of CPUSIM, a tool used to simulate Microprocessor. These YouTube videos have been highly appreciated by creators of CPUSIM and these links have been added to their



personal website and Wikipedia page. Over 10,000 views from across 20 countries have been recorded till now. Many of our students have been getting various scholarships. Parul Kumari and Manu Singh of Department of Mathematics received an award of Rs. 10,000 each from Directorate of Higher Education, Govt. of NCT of Delhi. Shourabh Singh and Gaurav Mamgain of Department of Electronics have received DST- INSPIRE scholarship of Rs. 60,000 per annum for pursuing higher education. Harshit Kansal of BMS II year, for the second time, received a scholarship of Rs. 10,000 under the Central Sector Scheme of Scholarships for College and University Students, 2017-18. Sidhav Gupta, student of BMS department secured second position in Inter College Competition on Climate Change-Trialthon of Knowledge held at Ramanujan College during September 2017. Sakshi Bansal, final year student of Psychology Department has been awarded the prestigious Gandhi Fellowship and has received acceptance from University of Nottingham with 100% scholarship to pursue M.Sc. Organizational Psychology. Her project "LEAP" (Literacy Empowerment Ability and Participation), has been selected as international social cause project by Rotary International HQ. Some of our Psychology students have also published their research articles.

The Placement Cell of the college works for the placements of its final year students in organisations of repute. A series of 3 workshops were held during October 2017 for the final year students by Talentio group who guided the students about all aspects from writing a resume to mock HR-interviews. The Placement cell also organized a series of 3 training workshops during January 2018 by T.I.M.E Educators. 14 students of BMS, 9 students of B.Sc. Computer Science, 2 students from B. Com. & 1 student from B.Sc Physical Science have been offered placements through college by various organizations such as S&P Global, A.T. Kearney, Ken Research, TresVista, British Telecom, Tommy Hilfiger and Deloitte. In addition to this, our 2014 Alumnus Mr. Sahil Banga, currently working with CPM as Assistant Manager, recently visited our college for a placement drive and selected two Commerce students as Management Trainees with a package of 4.5 lakhs. The average package for this academic year is 4.11 lakhs per annum.

A strong bonding with alumni is utmost important for the growth of any institution. This year the college has made efforts to start its Alumni Association. The faculty coordinators, Dr. Priti Sehgal and Dr. Anupama initiated the process and organised the first Alumni Reunion on 23<sup>rd</sup> December, 2017. Two students of 1995-98 batch, namely, Mr. Krishan Aggarwal and Mr. Ankur Jain, have been appointed as President and Secretary respectively, Dr. Amit Sehgal, of 1996-99 batch, has been appointed as Treasurer and 2009 pass out, Mr. Gaurav Bauddh has been appointed as Joint Secretary of the Alumni Association. Members of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and the Alumni Association work together for the upliftment of the college.

The Central Purchase Committee in collaboration with National Informatics Centre (NIC), Government of India organised a two day workshop on "E-Procurement Implementation" on 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 in the college campus. Dr. Arpana Sharma (Convener, Central Purchase Committee), Mr. Raj Kumar (S.O. Admin.) and Mr. Praveen Bhatia (S.O. Accounts) attended a two day workshop and training on "E-Procurement Implementation" on 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> November, 2017 in Bhaskaracharya College, University of Delhi.



The Anti-Ragging Committee along with the Proctorial Committee organised an awareness programme on 'Anti-Ragging Law' by Ms. Garima Bhardwaj, Advocate, North West District Legal Service Authority, Rohini Courts, Delhi, in September 2017.

Host of other activities were also organised throughout the academic year. The Women Development Cell together with the Hostel Committee organised an awareness programme to promote Women Empowerment and Hygiene in October 2017. The chief guest of the event was Prof. Neeta Sehgal, Proctor, University of Delhi . We are thankful to CSR foundation and ONGC for the installation of a Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine in the Girls Hostel. In February 2018, Women Development Cell collaborated with Delhi Legal Services Authority (DLSA) and organised an awareness programme on "Domestic Violence and DLSA Schemes". The speakers for the event were Mr. Dharendra Rana and Ms. Ruchika Singla.

The Entrepreneurship Development Program Cell (EDPC) of Keshav Mahavidyalaya was constituted in October 2017. This Cell aims at providing a platform for encouraging the students of the college with innovative ideas towards implementation. The cell organised an interactive session on "From Ideas to Fruition" in October 2017.

The college has always endeavoured to instil a sense of care for community amongst the students by actively engaging them in socially responsible initiatives. Under the aegis of Rotract Club, our students participated in a number of activities organised by the club at different locations: an Organ Donation Drive, Vriksharopan: a Sapling Plantation Drive, HIV Awareness Campaign, a Cloth, Book and Footwear Collection Drive, Women Sanitation Drive, to name a few. The NSS Unit also organised various activities: International Yoga Day, Swachhta Pakhwara, Rastriya Ekta Diwas, National Youth Day, National Voters Day, to name a few.

The North-East Cell of Keshav Mahavidyalaya provides a platform to all the students from North-East states studying in the college to share and sort out their problems. The cell spreads awareness amongst college students so as to amalgamate the nation with the cultures of Northeast India. Under the "Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat" initiative, the cell witnessed the cultural extravaganza of the North Eastern State Sikkim and observed the 'Sikkim Week' from 19<sup>th</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> March, 2018.

The college has recently initiated two new cells. The student entrepreneurship cell 'Enactus', is an international non profit organization dedicated to inspire students to improve the world through entrepreneurial action. The student coordinators for Enactus are Omkar Garg and Lakshay Syal of Department of Management studies. The finance and investment cell 'Nivesh' aims to inculcate financial awareness backed with reasoning and knowledge for the growth of all finance enthusiasts. Shubham Goel and Chaitanya Goel of Department of Management studies are the student coordinators for this cell.

This year, the college through the Fee Concession Committee, has helped 23 students hailing from economically weaker sections by providing financial assistance in the form of books worth Rs. 4500/- each. This year, 36 of our students have qualified for various state



and central government scholarships. The college is registered on NSP 2.0 portal and Delhi State Scholarship portal.

At Keshav Mahavidyalaya, students are encouraged to hone their leadership and managerial skills by allowing active participation in various cultural activities. The Cultural Committee along with the students of various cultural societies actively organised different cultural events throughout the year: The Fresher's Welcome Party, National Vigilance Week, Antarashtriyā Matri Bhasha Divas, Spic Macay "Virasat 2018". The Spic Macay event witnessed soulful qawwali performance by the very famous 'Hasnain Nizami and Troupe'.

One of the most awaited mega events of Keshav Mahavidyalaya is its Annual Cultural Festival 'TRYST' which contemplates great dedication and enthusiasm from all staff members and the students of the college. This year "TRYST" was held on 27<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> March 2018. The two-day fiesta concluded with a heartfelt performance by a prominent star from the Punjabi Music Industry, 'B-Praak' of 'Mann Bhareya' fame.

Various departmental activities were also held during the year. BIZWORLD, the Commerce Society organised an orientation programme in which CA Hansraj Chugh briefed the students about GST, speaker session 'ERUDITION'18' on the theme 'TRANSFORMING PASSION INTO PROFESSION' where Dr. PKD Nambiar, Marketing Strategist and CA Ashish Kalra motivated the students. Inter College Commerce fest FLEDGLING'18 was held in March. The department magazine was also released along with execution of plethora of events.

BLITZ, the Computer Society conducted a half day workshop on 'Cyber Security in Digital India' by Dr Anup Girdhar, CEO, Sedulity Solutions and Technologies and a full day workshop on 'Big Data and Hadoop' in collaboration with Aptech India. The Annual Technical Festival of the department was held in March 2018, which saw huge participation from students across colleges of University of Delhi. The department launched its e-magazine 'e-Blitzine' on the theme 'Industry 4.0'- the Fourth Industrial Revolution.

The Department of Electronics started the academic year with a two day workshop on 'EAGLE CAD & PCB Fabrication' co-organised by Centre for Electronics Design and Technology, NSIT, under the guidance of the team of SINCGRID LLP Company. A National Level Faculty Development Program on 'Embedded System Design Using AVR and Digital System Design Using Programmable Logic Devices' was organized in collaboration with CEDT, NSIT under the guidance of Prof. Dhananjay V. Gadre. The Elektronika society of the Department of Electronics also organised its departmental festival 'ELEXONIA-2018' in March.

The Department of Management Studies organised the ninth edition of its annual corporate seminar, COGNIZANCE in February 2018 and its school outreach event CHALLENGE ENRICH OUTPERFORM (CEO) in October 2017. Throughout the year the department also organised the several Guest Talks: 'Legal Issues on Incorporation of Startups and New Companies Act, 2013' by CS Reema Jain; 'Crypto Currencies' by Mr. Akshit Mittal, an alumnus of IIT Delhi and our college. 'Reminiscence' was an event held to celebrate the tenth anniversary of





establishment of the Department. Industrial visits to the office of Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) and to Micro Polypet Ltd. at Panipat were also organised.

The Department of Mathematics organised its inter college annual meet |Modulus|-2018 in the month of March.

The Department of Physical Education organised the Annual Sports Day on 16<sup>th</sup> March 2018. This year, the Delhi University Inter College Volleyball Tournament (Women) and Ball Badminton Tournament (Men) were organized from 7<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> January and 27<sup>th</sup> January to 4<sup>th</sup> February, 2018 respectively in the college premises.

The year 2017 marked the completion of ten years of the Department of Psychology. InPsych, the society of the Department of Psychology, organised the first Alumni Meet for the Decennial Year celebrations in September, 2017 and two workshops on 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2018 to help the students enhance their practical skills required in the field.

Now, I would like to inform that our faculty members, besides doing their professional duties, are also engaging themselves in curriculum upgradation, pursuing research, attending workshops and seminars. Three faculty members have successfully completed their Ph.D. The college congratulates Dr. Manjari Singh, Dr. Subodh Pandit and Dr. Ashish Bansal for the same. Some faculty members have presented papers and have publications in various journals of national and international repute while some have authored books. Six of our faculty members are supervising Ph.D. students. Dr. Vipin Negi has completed two years Post-Doctoral Fellowship of Indian Council of Social Science Research (ICSSR), New Delhi.

I would now like to highlight the efforts of our non teaching staff members in acquiring skills for professional competence by their participation in various workshops and training programs. Mr. P.K. 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## **SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE INITIATIVES**

### **INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE**

The University of Delhi is committed to creating and maintaining a community in which students, teachers and non-teaching staff can work together in an environment free of violence, harassment, exploitation and intimidation. This includes all forms of gender violence, sexual harassment and discrimination on the basis of sex/gender. To achieve this objective, the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is set up in each college of the University of Delhi for the Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace.

### **WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL**

Women Development Cell is a vibrant and incessantly active initiative of the college. It is an effort towards the empowerment of women in society and plays a vital role in addressing their issues in higher education, encouraging them to reflect upon women and gender studies and broadening the perspectives towards gender. It also focuses on multidisciplinary perspectives of class, race, ethnicity, age, along with several other contemporary socio-political issues.

The Cell along with Hostel Committee organised a “Women Empowerment and Hygiene Event” on October 8, 2017 during which a Sanitary Napkin Vending Machine was set up in the Girls Hostel of the college. This machine was sponsored by CSR research foundation. On February 5, 2018, it collaborated with Delhi Legal Services Authority (DLSA) and organised an awareness program on ‘Domestic Violence and DLSA Schemes’. The eminent speakers Mr. Dhirendra Rana (Secretary, DLSA-North) and Ms. Ruchika Singla (Secretary, DLSA, North-West) enlightened the faculty and students on above issues.

### **FEE CONCESSION COMMITTEE**

This year, the college through the fee concession committee has helped twenty three students hailing from economically weaker sections by providing financial assistance in the form of books worth Rs. 4500/- each.

### **THE EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL**

‘All people are equal, it is not birth, and it’s a virtue alone that makes the difference’. The Equal Opportunity Cell was established by the University of Delhi on June 27, 2006 to address the issues related to SC/ST/OBC, minorities and the differently abled on a continual basis. The cell decided to make every possible effort to make University of Delhi friendly for all ‘Persons with Disability’ (PwD). The cell in its pursuit to help such students has made all efforts for improvement in the overall infrastructure, and the learning and teaching process for the differently abled academic community irrespective of visual, hearing, orthopaedic or other kinds of impairments. The main focus areas of the cell since its inception are:

- Request the University to issue a Policy Statement on Disability.
- Ensure a barrier free access to all buildings of college i.e. departments, library, hostel and office.
- Set up a Resource Centre that would specialize in addressing the needs of PwDs in all categories including Visual, Hearing, Orthopaedic and Neurological etc.
- Set up Counselling Centre to address issues on psychological problems and employment.



- Examine all possible ways in which the SC/ ST/ OBC and minority groups can be helped.
- Ensure that there is no discrimination in the college on grounds of disability or minority status.
- Infrastructural provisions in the college: straight and tactile paths, accessible toilets, lifts, sign ages & sign boards.

The Admission Policy for differently abled students of the college totally adheres with the national commitment to diversity and inclusion. In accordance with the reservation criterion, the college offers admission to differently abled students in every course. At the time of admission, an Enabling Committee is formed to help the students with the admission process. Complete information is provided regarding the reservation of these students in the college prospectus.

### **DWARIKA – THE ANNUAL COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

Dwarika, the College Magazine is a platform for Keshavites to share their thoughts, ideas and outlooks. ## COLLEGE PLACEMENT CELL

The Placement Cell of the college works diligently throughout the year in its endeavour to reduce the gap between students and recruiters. The cell has student coordinators from each course to help organise various activities. The year 2017-18 has been immensely fruitful in terms of the companies that visited the college campus and the activities organised for the students. The Placement Cell organised three workshops for the final year students during October 2017. The workshops conducted by Talentio Group, covered varied aspects required by students to succeed in the job market ranging from writing a resume to mock HR-interviews. Another series of three training workshops were organised during January 2018 by T.I.M.E educators who shared their expertise on three important topics namely, designing a professional C.V., handling guesstimates and personal interviews. All the workshops were well received and appreciated by participating students. In order to promote a culture of internships, the Placement Cell associated with *Internshala*, the portal for internships. By undertaking summer and winter internships students are expected to discover their interests, learn new skills, build their confidence, and eventually land into great jobs. The Cell also actively coordinated with the Central Placement Cell (CPC) of University of Delhi for internships and placements, facilitated students to participate in pool campus drives organized by other colleges, assisted students in participating in off-campus as well as on-campus placement drives for the final year students. A number of companies like A.T.Kearney, CPM visited the campus for placements. The average package for the academic year 2017-18 is 4.11 lakhs per annum.
