Respected Mr. Dilip Pandey, National Communication Head & Convenor, Delhi State, AAP, Guest of Honour Mr. Adarsh Shastri, Parliamentary Secretary of Department of Information Technology, Govt of NCT of Delhi & Hon'ble MLA, Dwarka Constituency, Delhi, our Governing Body Chairperson, Mr. Samar Kumar, our Governing Body Treasurer, Dr. Rakesh Garg, other members of Governing Body, our founder Principal Dr. K. P. Chinda, other invited guests, my colleagues from teaching and non-teaching fraternity, dear students and their parents, a very good morning to all of you. I, on behalf of Keshav Mahavidyalaya, welcome you all on the occasion of the College Annual Day and Prize Distribution Function. I express my sincere gratitude to all the members on the dais for sparing their valuable time out of their busy and hectic schedule to grace our occasion.

Our college has successfully completed over two decades and has earned a great reputation, comparable to that of many of the campus colleges. The college at present offers nine courses in the disciplines of Science, Commerce, Management Studies, Psychology, and Computer Science. The college also offers short-term courses in French and German Language. In the current academic session, the student strength has been 1600 plus. The college has a Girls' Hostel running for the past three years with a capacity of 78 students where in they are provided with an atmosphere of warmth, peace, and security.

First of all, I am happy to share with all of you that this year our college has been awarded Grade 'A' by NAAC i.e. National Assessment & Accreditation Council. I am very thankful to our Governing Body Members, NAAC Steering Committee Members, other NAAC Committee Members and all the stakeholders of the college who have greatly supported the college NAAC Steering Committee members in putting up their best to accomplish Grade 'A' for the college. The hard work, put in by NAAC Steering committee convenor Dr. Anjali Thukral and her team members namely Dr. V.K. Sharma, Dr. Richa Sharma, Dr. Jyoti Anand, Dr. Amanjot Sachdeva, Dr. Divya Haridas and Dr. Deepak Srivastava, is very commendable. The services put in by ad-hoc faculty members especially Dr. R.S. Rajpurohit, Mr. Kunal Kumar, Mr. Himanshu Kushwah, Ms Nidhi Passi, besides all others are very commendable. The college is extremely grateful to all its staff members, teaching and nonteaching, who have put in their best efforts to get the institution, this much appreciated grade.

To bring about consistent quality improvements in all spheres of the college, an 'Internal Quality Assurance Cell' (IQAC) has been formed as per mandate of NAAC. The prime task of the IQAC is to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the overall performance of the college. For this, it channelizes all efforts and measures of the college towards promoting its holistic academic excellence. Prof. Neena Sinha from University School of Management Studies, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University and Mr. Vipin Sahni, CEO, National Accreditation Board for Education and Training, are the External Members of this cell. Others members include Dr. Priti Sehgal as Coordinator, Dr. Kanupriya Goswami, Dr. Rajni Mendiratta, Dr. Neha Sharma, Dr. Pardeep Kumar, Dr. Harpreet Bhatia, Dr. Mukesh and Dr. Amanjot Sachdeva as members. Dr. V.K. Tyagi, Member Governing Body represents the Management while Dr J.M. Khurana, Dean Student Welfare, represents Administration of University of Delhi. To represent various stakeholders, the cell has representation from students, their parents, alumni, a lawyer from local society and an industry expert.



The College gives due consideration to redressal of grievances of its students pertaining to different categories. For the said purpose, Dr. Arpana Sharma, Dr. Roli Bansal, Ms Meenakshi, Dr. Deepak Srivastava, and Dr. Dhanpal Singh, have been appointed as Nodal Officers for individual categories. To address the grievances of students at another higher level a Grievance Redressal Committee has been constituted as per DU guidelines with GB nominee Dr. S.C. Gupta, three senior teachers Dr. V.K. Verma, Dr. Shalini Kumar, Dr. Priti Sehgal and a student representative Satyam Jain of B.Sc. (H) Computer Science, II Year.

With a vision to attain higher levels of access, equity and excellence in the State Higher Education System, the centrally sponsored scheme of Rashtriya Uchchatar Shiksha Abhiyaan i.e. RUSA was launched by the Ministry of Human Resource Development. Under the scheme, the college has submitted an Institutional Developmental Plan, wherein, a grant of Rs. 2 crore is expected to be sanctioned for up-gradation of existing facilities in the college. The plan was developed and submitted under the able guidance of Dr. Kanupriya Goswami as Co-ordinator, Dr. V.K. Verma, Dr. Shalini Kumar, Dr. Priti Sehgal, Dr. Arpana Sharma and Dr. Surender Singh as Nodal Officers.

The MHRD launched a National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF) to rank institutes of higher learning. The broad parameters on which the ranking was based included 'Teaching, Learning and Resources,' 'Research and Professional Practices,' 'Graduation Outcomes,' 'Outreach and Inclusivity,' 'Perception' etc. In compliance with the same, our college NIRF committee headed by Dr. V.K. Verma as the Nodal Officer, Dr. Kanupriya Goswami, Dr. Arpana Sharma and Dr. R.S. Rajpurohit as members submitted the required data. However, the ranking of individual colleges by MHRD is awaited.

I now present with great pride, the names of our students who have topped in different years of various courses: Preeti Dabas (III year), Ayush Jain (II year), Satyam Jain (I year), from B.Sc. (H) Computer Science; Arti Gaur (III year), Samiksha Jain (II year), Navjot Thakur (I year) of B.Sc. (H) Electronics; Kajal (III year), Tanvi Gupta (I year) of B.Sc. Physical Sc.; Vishnu Priya (III year), Naman Sharma (II year), Ankit Chaudhary (I year) of B.Sc. (H) Maths; Shivani Sharma (III year), Prasun Prasad Kant (I year) of B.Sc. (G) Maths Science; Abhishek Tayal (III year), Saloni Goel (II year), Sonal Mittal (I year) of B.Com. (H); Aritra Mukherjee (III year), Harpreet Kaur Arora (II year), Jasmeet Singh (I year), of B.A. (H) Psychology; Anu Jain of Certificate Course in German; and Shikha Sharma of Certificate course in French.

For the last three years, the University of Delhi has been inviting innovation research project proposals from faculty members of its colleges in order to promote the interdisciplinary undergraduate research at the college level. This year four of our college "Innovation Project" proposals have been accepted and grants ranging from 3.5 lakhs to 5 lakhs per project have been sanctioned by the University of Delhi. The faculty members, from across various disciplines, are presently working on these projects with their own team of 10 students each.

The college has always endeavoured to instil a sense of care for community amongst the students by actively engaging them in socially responsible initiatives. Under the aegis of Rotract Club, the students collected and donated books to slum children. Clothes, soft toys,



basic stationery and grains were generously given out by students and faculty members to various Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) and schools where they could be used in the best possible way. NSS unit of the college also upholds the philosophy of caring and of giving back to the society. Our students visited blind school in Rohini and slum areas near the college to teach the slum children. A blood donation camp was organized in collaboration with Baba Saheb Ambedkar Hospital. It saw an overwhelming response and students and staff members collectively donated 100 units of blood. Students also took out street rallies in nearby areas for spreading awareness about prevention of polio and dengue.

Host of other activities were also organized throughout the academic year. Our Nation's Sixty Eighth Independence Day was celebrated by hoisting the tricolour and launching a tree plantation drive on 14<sup>th</sup> August'15. On the occasion of International Yoga Day on 21<sup>st</sup> June'15, Yoga expert Dr. Rathi from Yogashram & Research Center, Sector-3, Rohini, discussed the importance of incorporating Yoga and meditation in life with the staff members and students and practised with students some healthy Yoga asanas. The generous efforts of Yoga Acharya Sh. Aggarwal ji, along with their disciples, Dr Poonam Kathuria and Ms. Mamta gave the holistic approach to health and well being of the resident students of the hostel wherein practise of yoga was continued for over three months. The students and teachers came together to 'Run for Unity' to commemorate the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhai Patel on Rashtriya Ekta Diwas on 31<sup>st</sup> October'15. To aware the students about Women issues and their righteous solutions, the Women Development Cell (WDC) of our college invited on 2<sup>nd</sup> November'15, Ms Swati Maliwal, Chairperson, Delhi Commission for Women with other member of her commission Ms. Sarika Chaudhary who shared their experiences and discussed the challenges faced by women on everyday basis in a patriarchal society. The ICC, the NSS and the Women Development Cell (WDC) in association with Google, India and AIWEFA (All India Women Education Fund Association, Lady Irwin College) organized a workshop on 22<sup>nd</sup> September'15 on 'Cyber Security and Threat' to make cyber world a safe place for all. Dr. B. R. Ambedkar's contributions in establishing the foundations of our democracy were discussed by Dr. Dharmakirti, Retired Additional Director, Education, on Nation's Constitution Day, 26<sup>th</sup> November, 2015. The college also organized a seminar on the vision of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar and Indian Constitution on 12<sup>th</sup> April, 2016. Speakers for the occasion were Dr. K.S. Chauhan, Advocate, Supreme Court and Prof. Ujjwal Singh, Department of Political Science, University of Delhi, shared the vision of Baba Saheb with the students and staff members and laid stress on the importance of Indian Constitution drafted by him. A free eye check-up camp in collaboration with Centre for Sight was organized in the college premises on 12<sup>th</sup> February'16. The students and staff members benefitted from it.

The Fee Concession Committee of our college selected 20 students from various courses to grant them the financial aid for education. Each student was provided books worth Rs. 3500 to fulfil their academic requirements.

DWARIKA, the college annual magazine was published this year with remarkable contributions from the faculty and students.

The academic session of the college begins in the month of July every year with a warm welcome to the freshly enrolled students. The cultural committee of the college organized the Orientation Day for induction of new students on 20<sup>th</sup> July 2015 and Fresher's Welcome





Party was hosted for them on 4<sup>th</sup> September 2015. Ms. Purva Monga from B.A. (H) Psychology was chosen as Ms. Fresher & Mr. Sarthak Kataria from B.Sc. (G) Mathematical Science was adjudged Mr. Fresher. The students have continued to bring laurels and accolades for the college at variety of forums like IIT Bombay, IIT Delhi, SRCC, LSR, AIIMS and other universities across the country. Some of our students have been selected in reputed institutes of higher education by successfully cracking entrance examination of TIFR (Tata Institute for Fundamental Research), physics JEST (Joint Entrance Screening Test), JAM (Joint Admission test), University of Delhi, CAT etc..

The Department of Business Studies organised C.E.O. 2016, its annual event for school students. Dr. Sanjib Acharya, famous career counsellor, enlightened the students about career options. The department also held the sixth Annual Corporate Event, Cognizance in February'16. The theme this year was 'Decoding Success: How Ordinary People Get Extraordinary Results'. Mr. Deepak Bhardwaj, Vice President, Corporate Affairs, Samsung South West Asia; Guest of Honour Prof. Suresh Aggarwal, Dean, Faculty of Applied Social Sciences and Humanities; Mr. Ramesh Agarwal, CMD Agarwal Packers and Movers and Mr. Subodh Sangle, spokesperson from Mumbai Dabbawalas graced the occasion & shared their extremely valuable experiences to attain success in life.

The Department of Commerce and the Department of Mathematics organised their annual festivals 'Fledgling' and '[Modulus]', respectively, in the month of March 2016.

Department of Computer Science held 'BLITZKREIG', its annual festival this year on 15 March'16. Dr. Ajay K. Gupta, Department of Computer Science, University of Delhi, delivered a talk on University of Delhi's Networking Architecture. A successful seminar was also conducted in November, 2015 on the topic "Advanced Cyber Threats and Attacks" by Mr. Vidit Baxi, Director, Lucideus training company. He shared his knowledge about latest cyber threats and emphasised to take precautionary security measures for the same.

The Department of Electronics organized its festival 'ELEXONIA' in March 2016. Program and Technical Consultant, Mr. R.K. Singh from Delhi University Community Radio delivered a lecture on "VIDEO AND AUDIO COMPRESSION". He has motivated the college to start a centre for DU Community Radio.

## **SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE INITIATIVES**

### **INTERNAL COMPLAINTS COMMITTEE**

The University of Delhi is committed to creating and maintaining a community in which students, teachers and non-teaching staff can work together in an environment, free of violence, harassment, exploitation and intimidation. This includes all forms of gender violence, sexual harassment and discrimination on the basis of sex/gender. To achieve this objective, the Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is set up in each college of the University of Delhi for the Prevention, Prohibition, and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace.

### **WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CELL**

Women Development Cell has been persistently working towards engaging the students with 'Gender' as a process and a reality that one deals with on a daily basis. It has played a vital



role in the understanding of masculinity and femininity as social constructs that are further problematized when they converge with caste, communalism, labour, class identities, culture and social structure. As part of the ongoing endeavours to sensitise the students, Women Development Cell organized a workshop on internet, cyber security and cyber ethics, conducted by Google, India. It encouraged the students to beware of online fraudulence, financial deceptions, sexploitation and other cybercrime to live smartly in a knowledge - based society.

The Cell also proudly hosted an enlightening talk on 'Women Issues and Challenges' by Ms. Swati Maliwal, Chairperson, Delhi Commission for Women. She shared her invaluable experience of working with women from different strata of the national capital. It also broadened the horizons for students as they became aware of the challenges of living in a patriarchal society as well as the rights and responsibilities towards creating a balanced society.

### **FEE CONCESSION COMMITTEE**

This year, the Fee Concession Committee selected 20 students from various courses including many from the weaker section to grant them the financial aid for education. Each student was provided books worth Rs. 3500/- to fulfil his/ her academic requirements.

### **ROTRACT CLUB**

The club aims to instil in the students a sense of community by actively engaging in socially responsible initiatives and contributing in whatever way they can to uplift the current state of being. The college has been associated with the Rotary since 1995.

The members have been very active this year as well. One of the ongoing projects that the students have been involved in is 'Sakshar' the literacy program for slum children. They have not only gone on a regular basis to take classes for them but have also launched a books collection drive for simple and colourful books for them. 'Walk for Life' is another project that shows the students' awareness of the health issues of today. This is a cancer support initiative. A blood donation drive was also conducted in collaboration with the students of NSS. The students of Rotract were also an active part of the Polio Rally for spreading the message of "Keep India Polio Free". The club also organized a donation drive in the college premises. Students, teaching and non-teaching staff actively took part in this donation drive and donated items such as clothes, soft toys, basic stationery, grains, pulses, shoes etc. The club donated these things to various non-government organizations and schools where they could be used in the best possible way.

### **ENVIRONMENT CLUB**

"PRAKRITI", the Environment Club of the college registered 30 new student members this year. It was ensured that the members were representative of all the departments in the college, with one representative head of each department. A President was elected to help co-ordinate among students of the different departments.

Some of the events carried out by the club in the college include – poster competition on the topic "Say No to Crackers", distribution of dustbins in the college, and tree plantation in the college compound. Presently, work is being done on digging compost pits so as to have natural manure available for the lawns of the college.



The future plans include changing the electric lights in the college compound to solar powered ones, awareness campaigns for sensitizing students toward the environment, and making our college and areas around more green.

### **THE EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL**

“All people are equal, it is not birth, and it’s a virtue alone that makes the difference”. The Equal Opportunity Cell was established by the University of Delhi on 27<sup>th</sup> June, 2006 to address the issues related to SC/ST, OBC, minorities and the physically challenged on a continual basis. The EOC decided to make every possible effort to make University of Delhi friendly for all ‘Persons with Disability’ (PwD). The Equal Opportunity Cell at Keshav Mahavidyalaya in its pursuit to help such students has made all efforts for improvement in the overall infrastructure, and the learning and teaching process for the differently-able academic community irrespective of visual, hearing, orthopaedic or other kinds of impairments. The main focus areas of EOC since its inception are:

- Request the University to issue a Policy Statement on Disability.
- Ensure a barrier free access to all buildings of college i.e. departments, library, hostel and office.
- Set up a Resource Centre that would specialize in addressing the needs of PwDs in all categories including Visual, Hearing, Orthopaedic and Neurological etc.
- Set up Counselling Centre to address issues on psychological problems and employment.
- Examine all possible ways in which the SC/ ST, OBC and minority groups can be helped.
- Ensure that there is no discrimination in the college on grounds of disability or minority status.
- Infrastructural provisions in the college: straight and tactile paths, accessible toilets, lifts, sign ages & sign boards.

The Admission Policy for differently able students of the college totally adheres with the national commitment to diversity and inclusion. In accordance with the reservation criterion, the college offers admission to physically challenged students in every course. At the time of admission, an Enabling Committee is formed to help the students with the admission process. Complete information is provided regarding the reservation of these students in the college prospectus.

On 3<sup>rd</sup> March, 2016, URJA-2016, a talent hunt show for differently able students was organized. The Chief Guest for the day was Ms. Ira Singhal, IAS Topper 2015 batch. Differently able students from across universities participated in the competitions and were awarded cash prizes.

### **DWARIKA – THE ANNUAL COLLEGE MAGAZINE**

Dwarika, the College Magazine is a platform for Keshavites to share their thoughts, ideas and outlooks. The present-day education system is progressing to advance and nurture the hidden qualities and potentials of pupils. The 2015-16 edition of Dwarika highlights the importance of complementing the education system with the holistic growth and development of students so that mature beings of advanced society can be shaped. The magazine comprises of



numerous thought provoking sections, personal reflections, experiences and insights capable of making readers entrenched.

### **COLLEGE PLACEMENT CELL**

The journey of corporate freshers is complete when they score on offers from leading organisations from the industry. They leave the campus as true professionals, who with their astute analytical skills and enhanced business acumen, step confidently in the corporate world. For the academic session 2015-16, the cell in its pursuit to encourage diversity, self-reliance and peer learning among students, offered the Gandhi Fellowship Program through a placement drive on 6<sup>th</sup> October, 2015. Gandhi Fellowship Program is a full-time 2 year residential leadership program awarded to the inspired and inventive youth from top universities and colleges across the country. A workshop was also organised on “Career Options and Resume Building” on 3<sup>rd</sup> November, 2015. The workshop was conducted by International College of Financial Planning, a Bajaj Capital Venture. The companies that participated in the placement drives during the academic session 2015-16 were: AT Kearney, E&Y Global, S&P Capital IQ, Ken Research, Towers Watson, Grofers, Stanmax, ICICI Prudential, Smartican, Bluegape, Air Shagoon, Mera Job, to name a few.

Apart from final placements, Stanmax also offered internship opportunities to 14 students from the Department of Computer Science. TCS also offered “Open Ignite”, an employment opportunity in the form of web-based learning platform. It helps the science students to launch their career by improving their chances of being employed. This was again offered to students from Department of Computer Science. The placement process is still underway.

## **INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES**

### **LIBRARY**

The college maintains a well-stocked double storey, spacious fully automated library comprising of a large reading room. The library has various sections consisting of around 23,825 books. It has a rich collection of text books, reference materials and encyclopaedias of various fields. Large number of dailies, weeklies & periodicals of various subjects are being subscribed on a regular basis. 34 Magazines and 19 Newspapers are subscribed by the library for the readers. Library has more than 700 CDs and DVDs which are issued to various departments of the college. Besides, it also provides facility of accessing about 30,000 e-journals and research articles provided by Delhi University Library System (DULS) through internet to staff members and students. Library provides various services to its users like Circulation Service, Technical Service, Reservation Service, Internet Service, Reprographic Service i.e. Photocopier Service etc. The library has a separate Internet Lab for students and faculty. For the security purpose there are 16 CCTV Cameras in the college library. Keshav Mahavidyalaya Library has Braille Materials also for visually impaired users. The Library has one Lez Air Camera Scanner along with a laptop with Lex Air VAD software as well as Braille face and Devnagri Software.

### **AUDITORIUM**

The college has a state of art auditorium with a seating capacity of 800 people. It is fully air conditioned, built with best acoustics, high end light and sound facilities. It has been a centre



for all the cultural and academic activities of the college where all the staff and the students together enjoy and share their views. It fosters confidence in the college students by giving them a platform to come up and show their talents. Since its inauguration, the auditorium has been the testimony to the timeless talented performances. It also witnessed an array of eminent speakers from diverse fields of academics, management, IT, industry, governance, theatre, sharing priceless thought with the staff and students of the college.

### **HOSTEL**

Sprawling in an area of 2 acres and surrounded by beautiful lawns, Keshav Mahavidyalaya Girls' Hostel provides safe and comfortable accommodation facilities to young girls aspiring for higher education at Keshav Mahavidyalaya. The Hostel provides residential accommodation for 78 girls on sharing basis. The hostel is secured under CCTV surveillance and a security guard is available at its gate round the clock. It is strictly a 'No Smoking, No Ragging' zone.

Various hostel facilities include telephone and internet connectivity in hostel office, intercom, mess, sports, medical facilities and amenities like refrigerators, microwave ovens, iron, geysers, water purifiers, music system etc. The hostel administrative team includes Principal, Bursar, Warden, Matron, and Teacher Representatives on the Hostel Committee.

This year the number of hostel seats was increased from 72 to 78. Regular visits by a lady doctor have been started in order to keep a tab on the health of resident students. A first-aid box containing some patent medicines is maintained in the medical room to help residents during odd hours. However, in case of a medical emergency, the resident is taken to the nearest hospital and the local guardians/ parents are informed immediately. The college has a lady attendant and yoga training facilities are provided to students free of cost. Additional facilities like laundry services and permission to use room cooler are being planned to be allowed to students. Talks are underway to provide internet facility individually to them.

### **INTERNET AND WEBSITE MONITORING COMMITTEE**

The college Internet and Website Monitoring Committee regularly updates the content of the website, announcements and notices for easy access by the students and staff members of the college.

### **CENTRAL PURCHASE COMMITTEE**

The Central Purchase Committee facilitated the procurement of various requirements, from the departments (Academic and Administrative) of the college, in accordance with Central Purchasing Rules, Government of India.
