Subject: Violation of Generic Elective Course Norms – Urgent Action Required

Dear Sir/Madam,

This is to bring to your kind attention a matter of great concern regarding the violation of norms related to offering Generic Elective (GE) courses, as specified in the University letter no. DDA/447/2023/R4404 dated 15th May, 2023, and as outlined in the NEP-UGCF-2022 Guidelines.

It has come to the notice of the University that there have been instances of colleges offering/having offered Generic Elective courses that do not adhere to the prescribed guidelines for Sem-I and Sem-II Examination for student admitted in Academic Session 2022-2023. As you are aware, the purpose of offering Generic Elective courses is to provide students with multidisciplinary perspectives by enabling them to choose courses from departments other than their own. However, it has been observed that some colleges have offered GE courses from their core disciplines during Sem-I and Sem II Examination under UGCF-NEP-2022, which is in direct contradiction to the established University norms.

In light of this, the University has taken a firm decision to ensure the integrity of the academic process and uphold the principles outlined in the University's guidelines. As per the University's policy, credits for wrongly assigned Generic Elective courses will not be recognized. It is emphasized that the minimum credit requirement for students per



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semester is 18 credits, with a maximum of 26 credits, and recommended credit of 22 credits per semester. Students who have been assigned incorrect GE courses is required to appear for the correct paper as per the prescribed norms, and subsequently, earn the appropriate GE credits.

To facilitate the rectification process, we kindly request your cooperation in providing the following details for all affected students within your institution for Sem-I and Sem-II.

- (i) Details of students who were offered the wrong GE paper.
- (ii) Details of the correct GE papers that these students are proposed to take.

This information should be submitted to the University within 48 hours from the date of receiving this letter. It is important to note that no subsequent requests related to this matter will be entertained after the stipulated deadline.

By promptly furnishing this information, you will contribute significantly to the smooth resolution of this issue. Once we receive the necessary data, we will update the records of the affected students and issue correct admit cards accordingly.
