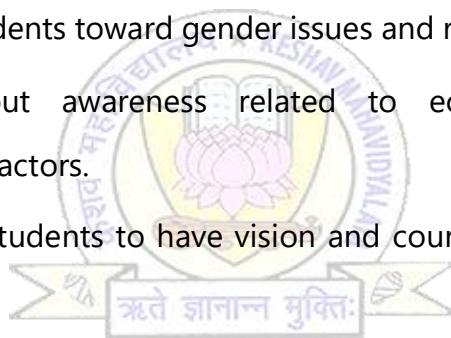

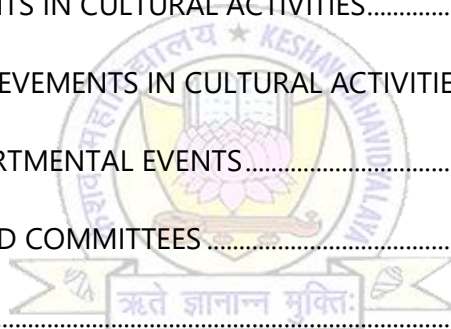

This academic session also marks a significant milestone in higher education, as the **fourth year of the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020** is being implemented for the first time. I am pleased to share that the transition has been smooth and well-received at Keshav Mahavidyalaya, reflecting the collective efforts of our faculty, staff, and students. It is a matter of pride that nearly 35% of our eligible students have opted to pursue the fourth year, demonstrating their keen interest in research, innovation, and advanced learning opportunities envisioned under the NEP framework. The fourth-year undergraduate structure, offering Project, Entrepreneurship, and Dissertation tracks, is now underway. 20 students have opted for entrepreneurship while the rest have chosen academic project or dissertation.

The college takes immense pride in the outstanding achievements of its students, who continue to bring glory to Keshav Mahavidyalaya through their dedication, creativity, and pursuit of excellence and Students across disciplines have secured top positions in university examinations and competitions. A particularly moving story from this year is that of our proud girl **Ms. Kishori**, an extraordinary young entrepreneur and student of fourth year **B.Com (Hons.)**, who lost her parents during the COVID-19 pandemic yet continued her education without seeking any help from her relatives with remarkable strength and determination and founded a startup *Tomeesta*. Her resilience stands as a true inspiration to the entire college community. It gives me immense pride to recognize the remarkable achievement of our students, **Mr. Vedant Unde** and **Mr. Varun Kukreja**, both from third year **BMS**, who emerged as National Winners of the E-Guerra (Retail & E-Commerce) National Case Competition organized by the Indian School of Business (ISB), Hyderabad, and sponsored by FundVice. Competing against 800+ teams from premier institutions like IIM Bangalore, IIM Nagpur, IIM Rohtak, and SSCBS, they

showcased exceptional analytical and strategic thinking, securing the first position and a cash prize of ₹1,00,000 (1 Lakh). Their achievement brings great honor to our college and inspires their peers to aim higher.

## Faculty Achievements

Our faculty members continue to make significant contributions to academia through teaching, research, publications, and supervision. Following are a few notable accomplishments

## Placements Made During Last Year

The college's placement cell, Start@KMV, connects students with industries, facilitating their placement. In 2024-25, 64 students were placed in various companies under the placement cell with an average salary of Rs. 5,00,000. The highest package offered was Rs. 8,50,000 by Oxane partners to 4 students of our college, **Pratul Prakhar & Hardik Kothari** from BMS and **Harshit Bansal & Hritika Kalra** from B.Com (H). A total of 21 companies offered placements to the students. The placement cell also organized orientation sessions, expert sessions, group discussions, personal interviews with guidance from alumni, highlighting the college's commitment to preparing industry-ready professionals.

## Students' Participation in Departmental Societies

Various departmental societies like *Bizworld* of Department of Commerce, *Blitz* of the Department of Computer Science, *Elektronica* of the Department of Electronics, *Metamorphosis*

of the Department of Management Studies, *Modulus* of the Department of Mathematics, *COSMOS* of the Department of Physics, *InPsych* of the Department of Psychology hosted their technical sessions, seminars, talks and various events throughout year.

## Cells and Committees

Keshav Mahavidyalaya has been at the forefront of impactful initiatives and events, fostering holistic development and community engagement. Various cells and committees such as ENACTUS, Gender Champion Cell, National Service Scheme (NSS), NIVESH, CONSULENZA, HAR GHAR DHYAN, Internal Quality Assurance Committee (IQAC), Internal Complaint Committee (ICC), Anti Ragging Committee (ARC), Women Development Cell (WDC) conducted a plethora of events and activities during the 2024-25.

A series of mental health awareness programmes and counselling sessions were organised by *Consulenza*, the cell under the Department of Psychology, to address students' emotional well-being. The Department also conducted its annual Mental Health Awareness Session on October 8. The *Enactus* cell, in collaboration with *Pehchaan* NGO, engaged over 100 underprivileged children through creative learning activities. The team further supported local artisans from Chattarpur, Malviya Nagar, and Rohini by promoting traditional crafts at Select City Walk and during *Tryst*, KMV's annual fest. Social projects such as *Pehel*, *Chakra*, and *Sahaayta* focused on women's empowerment, sustainability, and preservation of traditional art forms. These initiatives featured upcycled denim, handcrafted crochet products, and eco-friendly coconut shell candles. The institution reaffirmed its commitment to sustainability through the NSS campaign "Say No to Plastic," promoting a plastic-free campus. Student-led awareness drives and poster campaigns further advanced this cause. Under the *Gender Champion Cell*, various activities such as the *Pledge to Promote Gender Equality*, a *Poster-Making Competition*, and *Equality Graffiti Board: Smash the Stereotype!* encouraged gender sensitization. The *Entrepreneurship Development Cell* (EDP) fostered innovation through *Entrepreneurship's Edge* (October 2024), *Udhyamita: Ek Nayi Udaan* (March 2025), and the annual fest *Innoventure'25* (April 2025). The *Internship Cell* strengthened industry-academia collaboration, registering over 450 students for mentorship programmes. It facilitated more than 470 internship applications across diverse domains in partnership with 50+ reputed recruiters. The *Women Development Cell* organised an inspiring speaker session titled "Women in the Indian Army: Navigating Careers and Overcoming Challenges" on 6 November 2024. All these initiatives collectively reflect the institution's dedication to holistic student development, inclusivity, and social responsibility. They embody the college's vision of nurturing responsible, skilled, and empathetic individuals.

Keshav Mahavidyalaya has consistently upheld its position as one of the emerging premier institutions under the University of Delhi. In the past two years, we have taken several initiatives to enhance academic quality and institutional transparency.

The college **library** continues to grow and serve as a vibrant intellectual hub, now housing **over 31895 books (as on 31.03.2025)**. The library has procured 34 Magazines and

16 Newspapers during the year 2024-25. In addition to academic resources, the College-Library has renewed its membership of N-List–Database during 2024-25. Various e-resources (e - books and e - journals) provided by N List are available for KMV students and faculty members which they can access from anywhere and at any time through online mode.

The college does procurement and purchases using the **Government e-Marketplace (GeM)**. This system has streamlined transactions related to canteen and mess services, cultural events like Tryst, and housekeeping services.

With the dedicated efforts of our committee members, our college achieved a Full Compliance 4-Star rating under the **Eat Right Campus certification**, in accordance with the guidelines established by the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare.

Under the mentor–mentee program, each student is assigned a faculty mentor. Mentors regularly guide their mentees on academic performance, career planning, and personal development, ensuring that every student receives individual attention and support.

It gives me immense pride to share that the Department of Psychology will be hosting an **International Conference on “Interdisciplinary Pathways to Mental Health & Wellbeing,”** generously sponsored by the ICSSR and ICMR, on **October 30–31, 2025** in University of Delhi. This conference aims to bring together international and national practitioners, policymakers, scholars, students, and advocates from diverse fields to engage in dialogue, share research, and build collaborative strategies that support mental health and wellbeing across all ages and situations.

I extend my heartfelt gratitude to the **Director** and all members of the **Department of Higher Education**, as well as to the **Medical Superintendent and Doctors of Bhagwan Mahavir Hospital**, for their steadfast support and cooperation. I also acknowledge the valuable assistance of the **engineers from the PWD Civil and Electrical wings**, whose continuous efforts throughout the year have been instrumental in maintaining and improving our infrastructure. My sincere appreciation is due to the **local area Police Team**, led by the **ACP, SHO, IO, Beat Officers**, and other officials, for their consistent vigilance and collaboration. Their dedicated efforts in ensuring security and maintaining discipline have enabled the smooth conduct of various college events. ### Department of Mathematics

The department also released its annual magazine “Continuum 2025” (April 11, 2025), showcasing creative and scholarly contributions, and hosted its annual mathematics fest MODULUS’25, which included quizzes, IPL Auction, Shark Tank, and a treasure hunt, promoting logical reasoning, teamwork, and applied mathematical thinking among students.

### Department of Psychology

The Department of Psychology at Keshav Mahavidyalaya is dedicated to fostering both theoretical understanding and practical proficiency among students through its various cells and initiatives. ### Department of EVS

The Department of Environmental Studies at Keshav Mahavidyalaya conducted a series of enriching academic and outreach activities from April 2024 to June 2025 to enhance environmental awareness and experiential learning. ### RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CELL

These initiatives collectively contributed to 64 placement offers with a median package of ₹5,00,000, reflecting the cell's success and dedication.

## INTERNSHIP CELL

Keshav Mahavidyalaya's Internship Cell has made significant strides in bridging academia and industry, registering over 450 students for mentorship in resume building and professional applications, and processing 470+ internship applications across various domains. Collaborating with 50+ reputed recruiters, the cell saw a 100-fold increase in in-house internship offers, with stipends ranging from ₹12,000 to ₹20,000, totalling ₹2.1 lakh. To enhance student readiness, the cell conducted a Resume Building Webinar for first-year students led by Mr. Shobhit Gupta and Mr. Ayush Akarsh, and a workshop on "How to Ace Personal Interviews" by Mr. Anil Singh Bhadoria of TIME EDUCATION, providing practical guidance on resumes, skill development, interview techniques, and professional communication.

## EQUAL OPPORTUNITY CELL

The Equal Opportunity Cell of Keshav Mahavidyalaya strives to create an inclusive, equitable, and supportive campus environment, aligning with the University of Delhi's vision. The Cell is committed to ensuring that students from varied socio-economic, cultural, and linguistic backgrounds, as well as those with disabilities, are provided with equal access to academic resources, facilities, and institutional support. During the academic session 2024-25, the EOC actively created awareness for fee concessions, scholarships, and financial assistance available at the university and college level for students from economically weaker sections and PwBD. ## LIBRARY

As of March 31, 2025, it houses around 31,895 books across various sections, including a rich collection of textbooks, reference materials, and encyclopaedias from multiple disciplines. In addition, it subscribes to 34 magazines and 16 newspapers, and maintains a repository of over 740 CDs and DVDs, which are issued to various departments. Through its membership in the N-List Database, users have access to a vast range of e-resources, including e-books and e-journals, accessible anytime and anywhere. The library also provides access to thousands of e-journals and research articles through the Delhi University Library System (DULS). To support effective learning, it offers diverse services such as circulation, technical assistance, reservation, and internet facilities. For security, 32 CCTV cameras are installed throughout the premises. The library is also inclusive, offering Braille materials for visually impaired users and being equipped with a Lez Air Camera Scanner, a laptop with Lex Air VAD, and Braille and Devnagri software. Queries regarding library facilities are personally addressed by the librarian through the dedicated email ID- library@keshav.du.ac.in, ensuring responsive and user-friendly support.

## NCWEB

The NCWEB at Keshav Mahavidyalaya, University of Delhi, had a dynamic and enriching academic year 2024–25 under the guidance of Teacher-in-Charge: Prof. Vinita Jindal.
