#### MINUTES

A meeting of the Internal Quality Assurance Committee (IQAC) with the college faculty was held on May 8, 2018 at 12:30 pm in the Seminar Room. The meeting was held as part of an interaction to consider the faculty's suggestions and also to apprise the faculty of the viewpoints of the IQAC. The following IQAC members were present:

Dr. B. Raja Rajan, Joint Registrar, University of Delhi (Administrative Officer), Prof. Rita Singh, Department of Zoology, University of Delhi (Governing Body Member), Dr. Priti Sehgal, Associate Professor and Senior Teacher, Department of Computer Science (IQAC Coordinator), and Mr. Naveen Gupta, Director, Engee Advisor Pte Ltd. (Nominee form Industry), Ms. Vishwambhara Rathore, B.Sc.(General) Mathematical Science (IV Semester) (Student Member) and Mr. Kangkan Goswami, B.Sc. (H) Physics IV Semester (Student Member) could not be present.

After having introduced the faculty members to the IQAC, the Principal stayed for a short period of time. Subsequently the meeting was conducted by Dr. Anju Arora, acting coordinator, in absence of Dr Priti Sehgal. Prof. R. P. Tandon briefed the working of IQAC to the teaching staff and invited college. development overall the improvement/suggestions/viewpoints that were raised are mentioned below Lack of permanent for faculty and non teaching staff in the college (Dr. Dhanpal, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics)

- 1. Ensuring greater general transparency in decision making in every aspects
- 2. Need for College Building expansion, More Laboratories, More Classrooms, More Courses
- 3. Current Computer Labs need upgradation urgently as the systems have been condemned, current infrastructure needs to be strengthened, the 80 computer systems of Computer Science Department are 10-12 years old and outdated, the laptops issued earlier also need upgradation. (Dr. Roli Bansal, Associate Professor, Department of Computer Science)
- 4. Need to exploit e-teaching, MOOCs, creation of discussion boards .
- 5. Requirement of Photocopy shop inside campus for students' day to day needs.

- 6. An independent computer Lab facility for Commerce Department. More computer systems needed especially since the new CBCS curriculum of B.com (Hons) has a large lab component.
- 7. The ICT lab presently being shared between Commerce and Mathematics departments with steel almirahs being used as a partition creates difficulties in conducting simultaneous classes/labs in commerce and maths department.
- 8. Lap tops as part of e-learning initiatives were issued to some faculty members in 2007so now these outdated ones should be replaced to enable faculty for improvement in quality of teaching learning outcome.
- 9. A seminar hall with capacity of 250-300 is needed as the existing infrastructure for seminar/conference/workshop/faculty development program consists of only one seminar hall with capacity of 100 people only.
- 10. The process for starting new courses in college be speeded up to cater to the popular demands of parents, students and society at large.
- 11. Appointment of Vice Principal, Administrative officer for smooth functioning of college.
- 12. Ad-hoc appointment tenure to be flexible to avoid loss in salary;
- 13. Important recommendations of Staff Council committees should ideally be discussed with entire staff council before implementation;
- 14. Regular College teaching should be for 6 days in a week instead of current 5 days to make better class timetables;
- 15. Staff Council decisions 2009 onwards should be put up on college website;
- 16. Seniority list of faculty should be rectified as per current ordinances;
- 17. For better working conditions, more ACs are needed for the staff room, the current number of 3 AC in staff room is inadequate, given the size of room;
- 18. Need for more labs for Psychology Department and a Plagiarism Check software in the College Library
- 19. Requirement of Photocopy facility for teachers in regard to distribution of tutorial material/teaching resources for regular internal assessment;
- 20. Faster internet connection to facilitate research, current connection speed tends to be Slow.
- 21. Appointment of more staff in lab as there is lack of back up of Non teaching staff in Mathematics department for functioning of lab.
- 22. The above list may not be exhaustive, however the general crux of most suggestions was in terms of strengthening infrastructure (both physical and in terms of manpower), expansion of courses, and also for improving decision making and implementation processes.

Apart from above suggestions received from the faculty, the IQAC members also put forward their own views on quality improvement. Prof. Pritam Singh explained the concept of outcome based teaching and evaluation. He explained the need to focus additionally on Skills, Attitudes and Growth mindset when evaluating students apart from testing them on knowledge. The students should be informed beforehand of such evaluation parameters. So, for instance, the students should know that their conduct in terms of honesty (not plagiarising on assignments) would also form a part of evaluation. Mr. Ankur Grover asked for introspection about lack of student attendance and how this issue could be addressed. Dr. A.K. Malhotra explained the need to optimise quality delivery within existing resource constraints.
